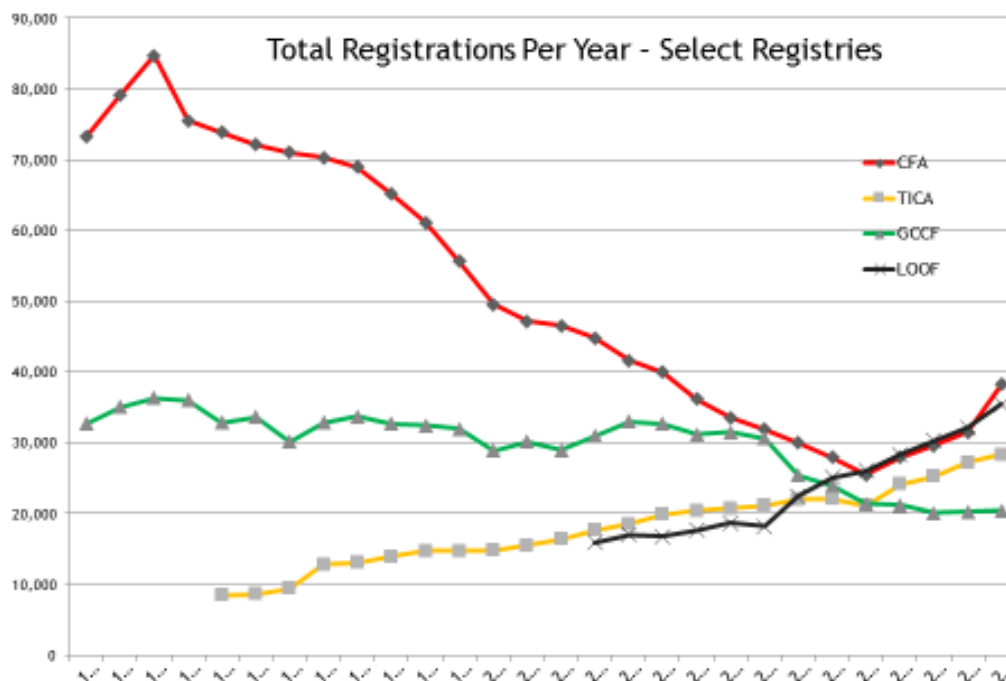

TICA is a Business

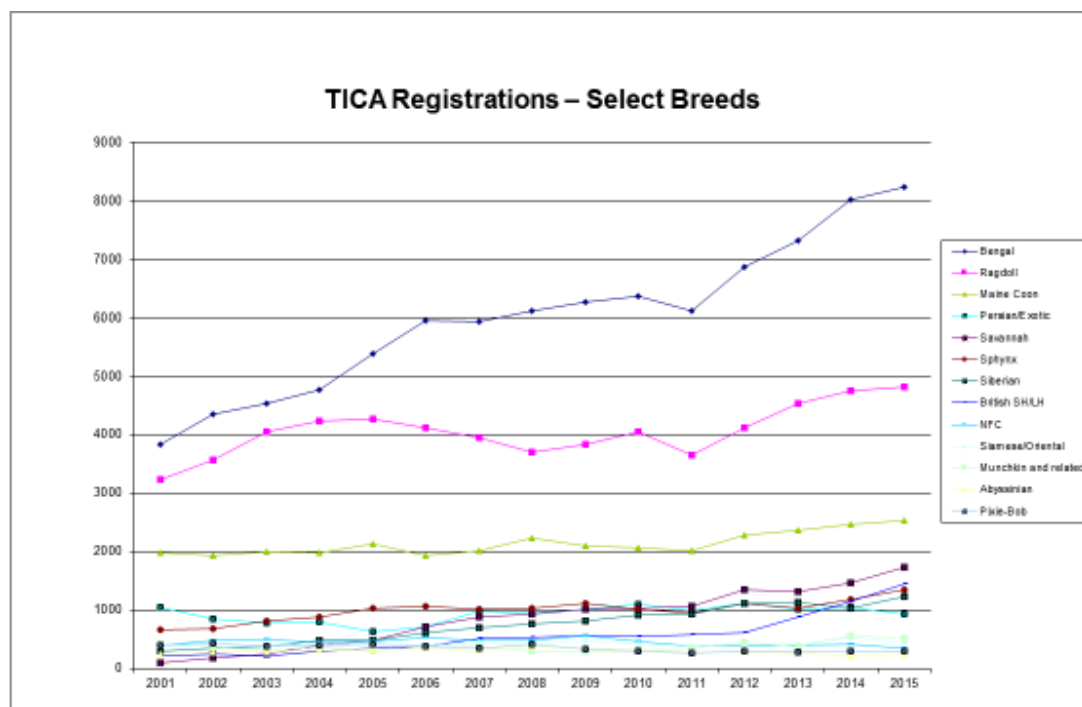
Though historically operating as a not for profit organization, TICA has only recently been given nonprofit status by the U.S. Internal Revenue Service. TICA is, and always has been, a corporation, subject to the limits and laws governing this type of business structure and including the fiduciary responsibility of its elected officials and officers to put the welfare and best interests of the corporation above their own personal or other business interests and to use appropriate care and diligence when acting on behalf of the corporation, including the personal acquisition of knowledge and skills needed to understand and execute responsibilities. They are expected to exercise reasonable prudence in carrying out their duties to achieve the best interests of the corporation.

TICA's "business" is a **Registry of Cats**. In accordance with TICA's prior business planning, TICA's success and health is partly measured by its registration activity.

The following graphic depicts registrations by year among select registries.



The following tracks the registration of selected TICA breeds.



An important set of data not available to the Committee is a breakdown between registrations originating within North America and those outside North America. Intuitively, the Committee feels that a decline in North American registrations is masked by growth outside North America – for both U.S. based registries.

What Does TICA Have to Market?

Fabulous felines, fun and friendship, of course! In a nutshell, TICA must market Cats, the Cat Fancy, and TICA, itself.

While cats currently enjoy an increased popularity, they are yet to enjoy the same perceived value as dogs. TICA’s basic business centers on the preservation of our unique cat breeds. While we embrace “ALL CATS” and cherish the non-pedigreed cat, a primary mission is to preserve the breeds and support the breeding and showing of healthy cat breeds. TICA’s cat shows, title and award programs recognize this effort.

Finally, it is important to market TICA, our organization. By striving to be the “go to” for all things “cat”, TICA becomes preeminent in the pet industry world and will attract additional corporate partners to support the advancement of the organization and the value of the cat as a companion animal. Clearly by our participation at pet expos and vet conferences, we have already attracted new corporate business partners.

Analysis Time

Considerable brainstorming time was spent focusing on scanning the environment for political, economic, social and technological factors that could affect TICA either positively or negatively and present opportunities. In addition, TICA was discussed as a business to identify strengths, weaknesses, and threats that could affect our association and its success.

With apologies, the Committee recognizes that their analysis is U.S.-centric, but still very important to TICA's future. Many observations apply all across TICA's world. Following are the primary environmental changes that influenced the Committee's discussion and recommendations.

Political Change

There is a noticeable lack of animal advocates except for the animal rights advocates (at both a local and national level.) More and more local governments in the U.S. are passing pet limits, mandatory spay/neuter and breeder licensing. With the lobbying for such legislation, animal rights activists are probably responsible for a cultural shift to "Adopt Not Shop" – causing the purchase of a pedigreed cat to be considered less socially acceptable than "rescue-ing."

Social Change



The Millennials: At the same time, a new generation is growing, with different views and perceptions of the world. The "Baby Boomers," who had been our cat fancy base, are rapidly taking second – and third place – to an upcoming group called the Millennials.

The U.S. Census Bureau reports that Millennials, or America's youth born between 1982 and 2000 (approximately 16-35), number 83.1 million, exceeding the 75.4 million baby boomers. This tech- and text-savvy group comprises 27 percent of the U.S. adult population, and, by 2018, their spending power will reach \$3.39 trillion. Market researchers note that there are currently 43 million pet owners in the 18- to 34-year-old-age group—which is 31 percent of all pet owners. "About 74 percent of millennial pet owners own a dog, nearly half own a cat," said Bob Vetere, President and CEO of the American Pet Products Association.

The following quotes are taken from pet industry readings.

- ***"Quite simply, not understanding them, not finding ways to be relevant or engaging to them, and not adapting to their new expectations are the easiest ways for a brand to fail."*** Kerry Sutherland, owner of K. Sutherland PR
- ***"Millennials learn of pet products through the Internet more than any other generation, but they use pet product company websites less than any other group. They tend to spend more on their pets than previous groups, and products that previous generations may have found as discretionary, the millennials are finding as necessary."*** Bob Vetere, President and CEO of the American Pet Products Association.

While the Millennials are devoted and discriminating pet owners, they also are presented with many, many ways to spend their leisure/entertainment time, are very tech savvy, and devotees of social media.

Cats Rule: Somewhat unexplained is the current social fascination with cats. There are more cat themed videos and photos on the web and social media than any other subject. We see cat cafes, cat video festivals, cats used in commercials, cat apps and even a CatCon.



Technology Change

Technology has advanced to the point that people are literally able to hold it in their hands. Technology is a necessity in allowing TICA to communicate with and service our customers and potential customers.

Technology will play an even more important role in the life of "The Millennial." "***Many of these millennials grew up leashed to the Internet. As a result, the 18- to 34-year-olds generally prefer a convenient, mobile shopping experience,***" according to a generational-spending study from The NPD Group Inc. in Port Washington, N.Y., and the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia.

TICA – The Good, the Bad, and the Ugly

TICA definitely has a lot going for it. It is genetics based (science integrated with cats), has a knowledgeable and expert judging panel, recognizes and honors both pedigreed and non-pedigreed cats, has strong corporate sponsors, and enjoys exposition opportunities that give it public presence and club support.

On the other hand, we still have low brand awareness – in part due to the fact that the cat fancy, in general, doesn't have the visibility of the dog fancy. We are lacking in our ability to communicate current information – especially to our clubs.

TICA's good fortune has always included a cadre of dedicated enthusiasts, accessing their personal resources of skills, abilities and finances. The reliance on the donations of time and talent from volunteers should be appreciated not overused. Evaluations of the tasks needed may be necessary to determine a distinction between utilization of volunteer organizational talent and taking advantage of good will. In other organizations this frequently results in "burn out" and the loss of the person's skills and pivotal organizational knowledge when they depart to other avocations.

TICA finds itself poorly staffed to implement new ideas and technology quickly. And, in reviewing the data on where the “cat lovers” are around the world, TICA has limited presence in some important developing areas. (These issues are not addressed in this plan as the Committee feels these are more within the purview of the TICA Board of Directors.)

Marketing – To Whom and Why

The Committee listed the following as potential market targets and purposes:

Where There’s a Will, There’s a Way

The Committee feels that TICA’s most important ways of reaching the target groups are through cat shows, pet expos, pet industry conventions and activities, social media/technology and educational outlets. Additionally, the Committee agrees that, given the huge diversity of our target populations, many different ways and means must be utilized to reach them. The Committee agrees that TICA’s #1 marketing tool is “The Cat Show”.

Pet Expos: TICA currently has a partnership agreement for booth space or show space with Amazing Pet Expos, partners with WPA’s America’s Family Pet Expo and participates in several other pet expos around the U.S. TICA has also supported presence at other pet expos outside the U.S. and should continue to evaluate

opportunities as they arise. While the pet expo presents a challenging show environment, it is an important educational outlet for cats, the cat fancy and TICA.

Industry Conventions: The pet industry continues to grow and is planning for the influence of the Millennials. TICA is the only feline registry member of both PIJAC (Pet Industry Joint Advisory Council) and WPA (World Pet Association). Our memberships give us access to industry research and insight. With the printing of the full color breed poster, TICA created a perfect opportunity to participate in various veterinary conferences, including the American Association of Feline Practitioners. Additionally, TICA was in attendance at Texas Unites for Animals. These have all been excellent exposure for TICA and have resulted in tremendous educational opportunities, corporate sponsorships, and dialog.

Companion animal-related scientific conferences merge as an important and strategically significant opportunity to positively market TICA, its breeds and members. The “genetic registry” characterization of TICA provides unparalleled ethos in scientific communities and among registries of any species. Feline breeds and genetic conditions are frequently discussed and TICA should be aware and potentially active in those conversations. The opportunity to establish greater collaboration between enthusiasts and researchers is mutually beneficial.

The Committee believes that other convention/conference opportunities exist for TICA to attend where a “cat presence” would be useful. We find that many conferences and conventions are VERY dog, rather than feline, oriented. We want to “Blow the Stereotype!”

Social Media/Technology: Even within the current demographic and not considering the considerable influence the Millennials are expected to have, TICA makes marginal use of technology to reach our potential markets. TICA is fortunate to have a dedicated group of volunteers who keep the Facebook Page fresh and fun, but other means of reaching our demographic (or desired demographic) are pretty limited – Twitter, Instagram, Pinterest, primarily. Twitter and Instagram could be used during events such as expos and conferences when there is already a social media push going with the event organizers. We should be able to piggyback on other social media networks. Instagram could be used to educate people on what cat shows look like and share the fun. A social media guide could be useful to



explain the use of hashtags, and which ones to use at shows, such as #TICA, #catshow, #catsofinstagram.



LinkedIn is also a valuable social media resource that lends TICA professional credibility, and is useful in branding TICA as the expert on "all things cat." Those who work to put on shows could be encouraged

to list TICA activities under volunteer experience.

A coordinated and active social media presence which includes generating information about TICA to be published and posted is extremely important and desirable. Unfortunately, the ability to reliably pursue this task is limited due to staffing.

Education: There is much that TICA has to offer about cats, from our judges and their interaction with breeders and public at shows to TICA University (TICA U). Other resources include our judges and members in scientific/research areas who could be used to insert TICA into serious feline study areas and enforcing the idea that TICA is a serious, professional organization, and the "go to" place for all things "cat."

Recent attempts have been made to revitalize TICA U, but the effort suffers from the lack of a coordinated plan and staffing to concentrate on updates, refreshes, and actual input of content. The Committee recommends dedicated staff to making TICA U a more effective educational tool.

A proposal was made for a more formalized Education Committee. The Education Committee would be responsible for the oversight of cat related educational offerings through an expanded role of TICA U. The Education Committee would be comprised of a Chairman, and Program Coordinators to coordinate, develop, and maintain the activities of TICA U. TICA U's audience would be the following groups:

TICA U's role would be expanded to include not only educating the general public as to the care, health and love of cats, but could also develop and offer curriculum for

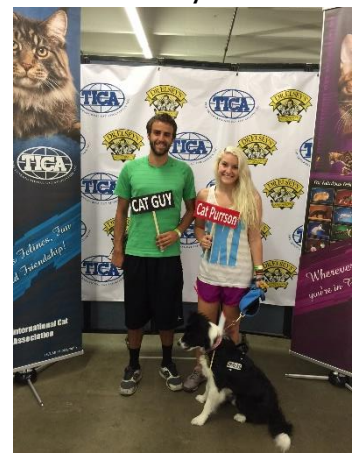
- Beginning breeders – e.g., Cats 101, similar to that which is required by LOOF to become a breeder in France.
- Possibly extended to offer a professional educational program for cat breeders that would be developed and accredited by a respected university.
- A depository of continuing education resources for the various groups identified above, such as reference materials from breed seminars, CEU events, educational symposiums, webinars, and online courses.

The Education Committee would work in tandem with the Marketing and Genetics Committees, to provide for the dissemination and development of continuing education opportunities on the TICA U website.

The Committee recommends using TICA U as an educational platform, along with the TICA website but recommends a commitment of staff resources to be successful and effective.

The Best for Last – Cat Shows: As mentioned before, cat shows are TICA's best and foremost way of marketing cats, the cat fancy and TICA. In order to attract the attention of potential breeders, exhibitors, and influencers, to the extent possible, TICA shows need to be an "event." They need to define and market to target audiences.

- TICA should have a Club Portal on the tica.org website for the communication of and distribution of resources available for clubs. This should include the information on how to put on a show, logos, sponsorship possibilities and general ideas and resources, supported by TICA.
- Shows should try to reach and be relevant to a multitude of audiences – Baby Boomers to Millennials
- Shows should include interaction of cats and spectators – cat ambassadors, kissing booth, games involving breeds, narrative about breeds
- TICA signage should be prominent; the Marketing and Outreach Committee will develop uniform signage
- Large shows should consider a dedicated TICA booth – a one stop shop – for information and distribution of TICA literature and materials
- Onsite HHP registrations might be possible at larger shows
- "Selfie" opportunities
- Increase awareness of local shows
- TICA "apps" to alert visitors when their favorite breed is in a ring, connect to catalog, and connect to catalog and breed descriptions.
- Encourage judges, as time allows during the day, to present and talk about the cats in their ring to spectators and exhibitors alike. This discussion can range from what the judges are looking for when they judge a cat against a standard to Household pets to scoring and any variety of topics.

How About In Reach?

We've talked a lot about outreach activities, but how about activities aimed at recognizing and supporting our current members, exhibitors and breeders? Certainly, providing more information on breeding and health issues on TICA U is a plus for our breeders, along with providing access to the

breeds and breeders through the outreach activities. Judges should be encouraged to be more vocal during judging in stating what they are and are not looking for in breeds. If we want to encourage healthy breeds, we have to discuss in the rings what we want to see and what we don't want to see.

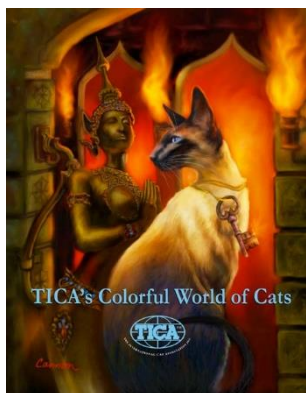
As we fancy ourselves as being the "friendly" organization, the Committee was interested in supporting a regional proposal to provide a "hospitality" bag to new exhibitors. The Committee will look into how to support this effort at the corporate level.

The Committee believes polling TICA members would be useful for further marketing planning. The poll would attempt to gather their thoughts on issues like: Why do you show? What would you like to see at shows? Etc.

The Committee also feels that the monthly TICA e newsletter could be a more effective communications tool with a dedicated resource.

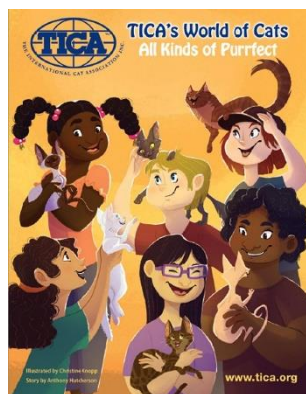
The Committee also discussed the development of a "loyalty program" and may make a recommendation at a later date.

Finally, the Committee felt that the current lack of resources will stymie efforts to implement marketing and communications efforts. It is recommended that resources be allocated to hire a person to be responsible for supporting TICA communication, education, publications and outreach efforts.

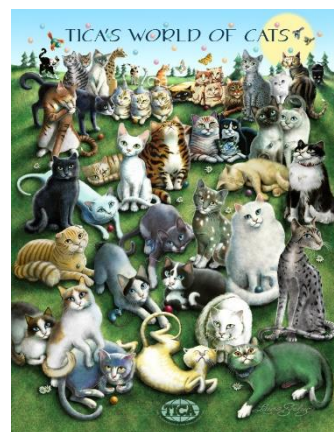


TICA Resources

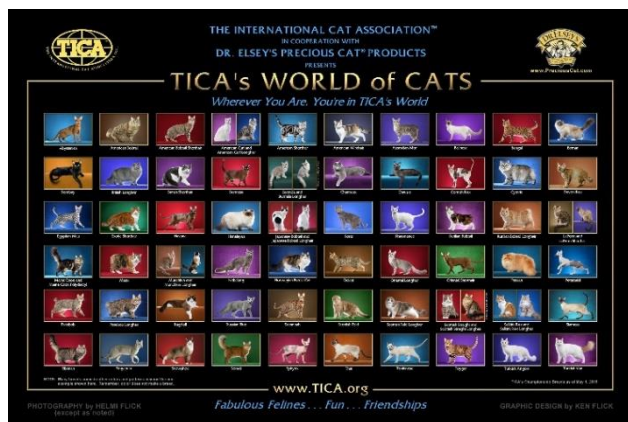
TICA is rich in the number of and variety of outlets and materials it has at its disposal for marketing purposes. TICA is now publishing two coloring books, one just now available in Spanish. These books are directed to children, but with the current adult coloring craze, they are also appealing to adults. Many of the books are being used in classrooms and veterinarian waiting rooms, along with primary distribution at pet expos, cat shows and events. The term, TICA's Colorful World of Cats, has been trademarked.



TICA's visitor guide, TICA's World of Cats (also trademarked) has been an important publication for all outreach events. The publication includes much of the same information available in current brochures, but also includes pictures and descriptions of all of TICA's currently recognized cat breeds. The publication is currently in production with a new cover, fresh content, and updated breed



information. The guide provides an advertising outlet to both TICA breeders, corporate partners and corporate advertisers.



The full color breed poster has been a huge success within the veterinarian, vet school, shelter, and grooming areas. It has been an important calling card for TICA at animal veterinary events. The Committee feels distribution has lagged and a way to continue distribution outside of the currently planned conference events needs to be developed.

TICA U and the main TICA website have been discussed previously. Both have great potential

as educational outlets for both TICA's clients and potential clients.

A special TICA logo has been developed for use in outreach events. Sporting a stylized cat, it immediately identifies TICA's name with all things "cat."



Summary of Recommendations

Whether through a formal Education Committee or not, The Committee recommends dedicated staff to making TICA U a more effective educational tool.

It would include information on how to put on a show, logos, sponsorship possibilities and general ideas and resources, supported by TICA. A social media guide would be a useful addition.
4. TICA signage should be prominent and uniform.
5. The Committee recommends creating a "tool chest" of ideas to be available to clubs in order to make the shows "interactive." This could include supplies distributed at the TICA corporate level.
6. The Committee recommends it pursue corporate level support for a new exhibitor welcome bag and possible "swag."
7. The Committee recommends polling TICA members to gather their thoughts on issues like: Why do you show? What would you like to see at shows? Etc. This input would be useful for further planning by the Marketing Committee.
8. The Committee recommends have a dedicated resource for the monthly TICA e-newsletter in order to make it a more timely and effective communication and educational tool.
9. The Committee would like to pursue the idea of a "loyalty program" for TICA members.
10. It is recommended that resources be allocated to hire a person to be responsible for supporting TICA communication, education, publications and outreach efforts. TICA should have clear and consistent delivery systems for information, rules, and materials. A communications person who takes the lead on getting information out to everyone, without a duplication of efforts, would be key in TICA providing a clear and consistent message.
11. A plan to further push the distribution of the breed poster needs to be developed.
12. The Marketing Manager should continue efforts to recruit corporate partner support in order to implement or offset the cost of implementation of marketing projects as possible.

Communications Coordinator

Reporting to the TICA Manager of Marketing and Business to Business Development, the Communications Coordinator is responsible for organizing and overseeing the creation of promotional materials and brand identity and supporting communication with Members and clients. The job requires knowledge of TICA's business, the cat fancy and cats. It requires a creative and analytical mindset and the ability to support TICA's motto: "Fabulous Felines, Fun and Friendship."

Position Description

The Communications Coordinator oversees and manages TICA's social media presence, designs and reviews or coordinates the design of promotional materials, promotes TICA activities through various communication methods, and ensures that communication with Members and clients is informative and timely.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

- Edits and publishes the monthly TICA e newsletter.
- Designs marketing and promotional materials or coordinates with volunteers or other contractors.
- Reviews and Edits all promotional materials prior to distribution.
- Distributes print and online marketing materials.
- Analyzes TICA's social media and online presence.
- Contributes to TICA blog or websites.
- Assists in redesigning website as necessary.
- Maintains TICA's presence on social media sites like Twitter, Instagram and Facebook.
- May help organize and oversee promotional events.
- Writes content for newspaper or magazine articles and ads.
- Researches ways to reach a wider consumer base, either online or in print.

Required Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

- Demonstrates strong writing and editing skills, including a superior knowledge of English and grammar.
- Exhibits knowledge of TICA's identity, mission, and goals.
- Familiar with and proficient in social media tools and apps,
- Basic knowledge of Photoshop or equivalent design program.
- Blogging or writing experience
- Exhibits proficiency in Microsoft Office Suite including Word and Power Point
- Familiar with website design and development
- Is capable of thinking creatively and analytically.
- Able to work independently and with a variety of different individuals.
- Is able to conduct independent research into target markets.
- Demonstrates knowledge of TICA's direct competitors.
- Able to support TICA's educational mission.

Board Governance

ARTICLE TWO: *Ethics*

Confidentiality. Members of the Board of Directors shall use information belonging to or obtained through their affiliation with TICA solely for the purpose of performing services as a Board member for TICA. ~~All such information is confidential.~~ Members of the Board may not disclose, divulge, or make accessible confidential information to any person, including relatives, friends and business and professional associates, other than to persons who have a legitimate need for such information and to whom TICA has authorized disclosure.

~~Members of the Board of Directors are reminded that Standing Rule 109.2.8 specifically prohibits the dissemination of information related to any matter discussed in Executive Sessions of the Board.~~

Members of the Board must exercise good judgment and care at all times to avoid unauthorized or improper disclosures of confidential information.

ARTICLE SEVEN: Publishing Minutes of the Meetings ☐ General and Executive Session Reporting Executive Sessions

It is expected that the published minutes of the General Board Meeting record that the Board went into Executive Session, the purpose of the session and the outcome of the discussion. For example, the general minutes of the meeting may record that, "the Board went into Executive Session to consider advancement and re-licensing of judges."

The general minutes would then record the outcome of that consideration, including the name of the maker and second of the motion. ~~The outcome of voting on motions will either be noted as "carried" or "denied". The use of "carried unanimously" shall be used only if requested by the Chair and agreed to by the Board.~~ **The general minutes will include the individual vote of each board member by name.**

~~Exempt from reporting in the general minutes would be the outcome of charges, complaints or protests which were found to be groundless. In accordance with Standing Rules 109.2.7, the Board will maintain separate minutes of the Executive Session Meeting, in the form of a confidential addendum if discussions and actions are taken on matters prohibited from dissemination to Members under By-Law 19.2.7.~~

RATIONALE: TICA is now a federal non-profit and as such, subject to greater regulations and expectations of disclosure and transparency than previously. Recording the votes of individuals by name as well as the abstentions will ensure proper voting records.

BY-LAWS

19.2.4 All meetings shall be open to the public unless the matter under discussion concerns personnel matters or contract negotiations, or is of a sensitive business nature related to business strategy for the organization, or is of such a nature that it may be embarrassing, derogatory or humiliating to ~~a member~~ **an individual**, in which case the Board of Directors may go into closed session.

RATIONALE: In practice, we don't really treat complaints against non-members any differently and memberships may lapse for a few months between renewals.

19.2.7 The full minutes, ~~except any minutes relating to charges, complaints, or protests which have been found to be groundless,~~ **excluding specific information that may be discussed under Article 19.2.4**, of the meetings of the Board of Directors shall be provided to any member upon the request of that member and payment by the member of the cost of reproducing and mailing those minutes.

RATIONALE: As currently written, these two By-laws do not blend together. They should be consistent with the obligations under our non-profit status. Our minutes should be available to our members. Making the change to 19.2.7 would allow the minutes to be published with exclusion of any information that may be considered confidential in our discussions while in executive session.

STANDING RULES

~~109.2.7 Restrictions. All matters restricted under ARTICLE NINE, 19.2.8 will be printed in a confidential addendum to the minutes with the admonition that information contained therein is prohibited from dissemination to any persons. "All members and officials of the Board in Executive Session are admonished that all matters discussed in Executive Session may NOT be disseminated orally or electronically or in any other manner."~~

RATIONALE: There is no longer a need for Standing Rule 109.2.7 with the revisions to the above By-Laws and Board Governance Policy.

Amend 33.8.3 - Championship Advancement Criteria (Board Directive)

Following the Winter 2016 Board meeting, Rules Committee was directed to put forward this amendment to clarify an ambiguity in the advancement criteria.

In 33.8.3, the requirement is to provide a “List of at least 35 shows licensed by WCC organizations of which at least 10 must be TICA shows where cats have been exhibited, including regions/countries and judges.”

For the 10 shows referred to, the Board agreed that this should be clarified as 10 TICA shows whilst the breed is at the ANB level.

Note that additional TICA shows could be listed as part of the 35 – but these need not be at ANB level.

Amend Registration Rule 33.8.3:

33.8.3 List of at least 35 shows licensed by WCC organizations of which at least 10 must be TICA shows where cats have been exhibited **whilst the breed is at ANB status**, including regions/countries and judges. A show shall be defined as a “show catalog” for this purpose.

Rules Committee Comments:

(A) Having a requirement of only 10 TICA shows while in ANB seems like a pretty thin requirement to me.

(B) It is a minimum. The cats still have to be shown in at least 35 shows. It is a balancing act and the rules were revised back then because the Board felt that actually getting to Championship in TICA (having gone through all the previous stages) was very difficult - especially for transfer breeds.

Marker

Amend Show Rules 212.3, 212.4 – Top 10 Allbreed Alters (Dopko)

Rationale:

The entries in the Alter class have changed over the last 5 to 10 years. So much so that the judges are constantly commenting that the Alter class has now become one of the most competitive classes in TICA due to the number of high quality of Alters in the show ring today. Alter exhibitors have changed over the years as well. There is an increase of Alter-only exhibitors (non-breeders) competing. As a result, the HHP and Alter classes appeal to the TICA members who do not breed, do not consider the shows as part of a cattery business and simply show as a hobby and out of a love for our cats. It is widely known that many TICA breeders started out by showing HHPs and Alters and then gradually made the transition to becoming breeders. Changing the current Alter Finals rule would provide more incentive for the hobby exhibitor, especially the new or first time exhibitors, as the HHP and Alter classes are where TICA needs to be enticing exhibitors to eventually consider breeding in the future.

TICA already splits the Alters into LH and SH Speciality classes and offers a Top 5 regardless of count. As a result, this should not be a stretch to offer a Top 10 Alter Allbreed class regardless of count.

By increasing the AB Alter finals to equal the number of cats competing up to a maximum of 10, this also helps increase our show counts. Currently, the more competitive TICA exhibitors are concentrating on supporting the shows that have a minimum count of 25. Since the economy took a down turn in 2008, the shows with a routine count of 18 to 20 Alters have suffered as a result of Alter exhibitors choosing to attend shows known for having larger counts. By increasing the number of finals, this gives the TICA hobby exhibitor more incentive to support the smaller shows and helps increase entries and revenue for those shows. Again, keeping those exhibitors participating in the TICA show world and eventually increasing our breeders.

I come from the horse show world, as a judge, competitor and breeder. Due to the economy crashing in 2008, we had one major division in particular that began to suffer and we eventually changed the rules to reflect something similar to my proposed rule change for the TICA Alter division. There was much discussion in regards to the pros and cons and whether this would provide an incentive or lead to a false sense of accomplishment by potentially awarding lesser quality animals. What we have found over the last five years, though, has been the opposite. The high quality horses are still present at our horse shows, but by “tweaking” our rules, we in turn helped increase exhibitor attendance during a tough economic down turn. As a result, the smaller shows with less exhibitors that began suffering through 2008 to 2010 have now increased in numbers and we are back to seeing these shows thrive despite the current economy. And again, we are ultimately creating an incentive to ensure many of these exhibitors continue to participate in our industry

and eventually make the move into becoming future breeders or supporting the industry in other aspects. I hope for the same success rate for TICA!

Proposed rule change:

Amend, 212.3, add new 212.4.2, renumber and amend existing 212.4.2 and 212.4.3

212.3 If there are FEWER THAN 10 cats, **or** kittens, ~~alters~~ competing, judges in either allbreed or specialty rings shall present the top five. However, if there are fewer than five entries in any class, the club is required to provide rosettes for the number of entries competing.

212.4 Number of Rosettes Awarded

212.4.1 Household Pet Adults and Household Pet Kittens - The number of rosettes awarded in the HHP adult class and Household Pet kitten class shall be equal to the number of cats competing up to a maximum of 10.

212.4.2 Alters - The number of rosettes awarded in the Alter allbreed rings shall be equal to the number of cats competing up to a maximum of 10. If there are FEWER THAN 10 alters competing in specialty rings, judges shall present the top five.

212.4.~~2~~**3** Top 5 Format - 20 or Fewer Cats Present: When 20 or fewer cats, **or** kittens, ~~alters~~ are present, the judge shall award Best through Fifth Best final awards.

212.4.~~3~~**4** Top 6 to 9 Format - 21 to 24 Cats Present: When 21 to 24 cats, kittens, alters or household pets or household pet kittens are present, the judge shall award final awards as follows:

When 21 cats are present, Best through 6th Best, except **Alters**, HHP Adults and HHP Kittens, See 212.4.1 **and 212.4.2.**

When 22 cats are present, Best through 7th Best, except **Alters**, HHP Adults and HHP Kittens, See 212.4.1 **and 212.4.2.**

When 23 cats are present, Best through 8th Best, except **Alters**, HHP Adults and HHP Kittens, See 212.4.1 **and 212.4.2.**

When 24 cats are present, Best through 9th Best, except **Alters**, HHP Adults and HHP Kittens, See 212.4.1 **and 212.4.2.**

Amend 901.4.3.4 – Amend RW Criteria (Stadter)

Rationale:

As 901.4.3.4 is currently written it is a requirement for the actual owner of the cat in question to have shown the cat in order to obtain an RW. So having been shown by an agent wouldn't count.

Although it is unlikely that the EO would interpret the rule so strictly, the rule should be corrected to match current practice.

Rules Committee Note:

The sentence about showing within the region is already set out in 901.4.3.2 so does not need to be repeated here. Rules 901.4.3.4 and the sub-sections are really about how those RWs are recognised in the Regions and by TICA.

Amend Standing Rule 901.4.3.4

901.4.3.4 Regional Awards. Regional Awards will be presented to the 25 cats, kittens, alters, household pets, household pet kittens and 25 longhair cats and 25 shorthair cats having the highest aggregate points of all cats, kittens, alters, household pets and household pet kittens, as applicable in the region. ~~***In order to receive a Regional Award, the owner of the cat, kitten, alter, household pet and household pet kitten must have exhibited the cat, kitten, alter, household pet or household pet kitten, as applicable, in at least one TICA sanctioned cat show in the regions presenting the award during the show year for which the regional award was earned.***~~ All awards earned during the show year will be listed accordingly for every region or recognized area and internationally.

Rules Committee Comments:

(A) looks good

Amend 907.2 – Amend RW/IW in Registrations (Stadter/Wood)

Rationale:

These rules date back to 1996, when we believe that the EO started to record RW and IW automatically onto registration records, with the provision that winners in previous years could apply to have it added to their record.

Rule 907.2.1 is now obsolete, since it is highly unlikely that anyone will apply for a RW/IW title to be added to a registration record for a cat that is over 20 years old!

907.2 does not take account of the increase to Top 25 RW and IW.

In addition the fees quoted in these rules do not match the current price list.

Amend Standing Rule 907.2

907.2 RW/IW. Beginning the show year 1996-97, International Winner (IW) and Regional Winner (RW) will automatically be added to the ~~TOP 20 CAT, LH/SH CAT, KITTEN, ALTER, HOUSEHOLD PET or HOUSEHOLD PET KITTEN winners in the records~~ **registration records of winners** at the Executive Office. A new Certificate of Registration with the title added to the cat's name may be requested by submission of the original certificate ~~and a \$7 fee~~ **and the fee for a duplicate record according to the current price list. Alternatively, the owner can use TICA's online services to reprint their registration certificate.**

Delete Standing Rule 907.2.1

907.2.1 **Rule deleted** ~~Effective 05/01/97, a cat or kitten that has achieved the official status of International Winner or Regional Winner as Top 20 CAT, LH/SH CAT, KITTEN, ALTER, HOUSEHOLD PET, or HOUSEHOLD PET KITTEN shall be entitled to apply for the prefix International Winner (IW) or Regional Winner (RW) to be added to its official registered title regardless of the year in which the title was won. In order to have the title added to the cat's record, previous years' winners must submit a copy of their award certificate (TOP 20 only) to the Executive Office. A new Certificate of Registration with the title added to the cat's name may be requested by submission of the original certificate and a \$7 fee.~~

Rules Committee Comments:

(A) Fine by me

(B) Brings the rule up to date.

Amend 410.1.1 Guest Judges (Anderson)

Rationale:

I would like to request an amendment be made to Article Ten - Guest Judges in the Judging Program.

I am experiencing too many late requests for judges that give myself and the committee less than a month to process the request. This also slows licensing of the show as it cannot be licensed until the guest judge is approved and I send notice of same to the EO. I don't mind if it is an emergency situation, but surely show managers are aware of their judging needs more than 2 months out, so I believe that this should be fair.

(Rules Comment: the addition of the new Standing Rule is to ensure that the requirement will be seen by all Show Managers, since they may not necessarily look at the Judging Program rules).

Rule Changes:

Amend Judging Program 410.1.1

International Guest Judge. A club may apply to the International Judging Committee for approval for a licensed Allbreed judge from another cat association to judge a TICA show. Application shall be made on the official TICA Application for Invitation of International Guest Judge. **The application should be submitted at least 2 months prior to the date of the show.**

Add new Standing Rule 202.4.4.2

202.4.4.2 - Applications to invite a Guest Judge to judge a TICA show need to be submitted to the Judging Administrator at least 2 months prior to the date of the show. For the process and requirements see Article Ten - Guest Judges in the Judging Program.

Rules Committee Comments:

Amend Clerking Manual 51.2.5 (Test Fees) – Board Directive

Rationale:

The Winter 2016 Board Meeting records “46. Unanimous consent by Crockett to send to the Rules Committee: Remove the annual fee for both the clerking and entry clerking programs. If the test is submitted on a timely basis-no fee. If the test is late charge a \$10 late fee. Without objection.”

Pros

- The fee was originally put in place to cover the cost of paper, printing & postage. Everything is now done electronically.
- Less work for the EO.
- To prevent any miscommunication between the Clerking administrator and the EO.
- Encourage more people to enter the clerking program.

Cons

- Introducing a rule change which would apply to very few members and would give addition work to both the EO and Clerking Administrator

Rules Committee also notes that exams are now mostly emailed, and proposes an additional minor amendment to 51.2.5.3.

Amend Clerking Manual Rules:

51.2.5.1 Payment of TICA membership dues ~~and a \$5 annual recertification fee on or before May 1 of each year.~~

51.2.5.3 The re-certification exam must be returned to the Clerking Administrator within 60 days of the date when the exam was mailed **or emailed**. Failure to comply with this deadline will result in the Trainee or Clerk ~~being dropped from the Clerking Program~~ **being assessed a penalty of \$10 and being given an additional two weeks to complete and return the test.**

Rules Committee Comments:

A) I've never understood why you get dropped anyway. Works for me!

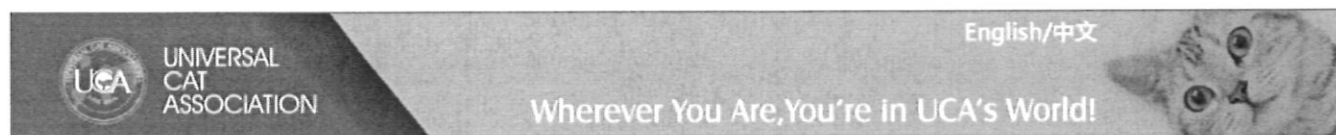

Part 1: TICA registrations of cats bred in Italy

Article 1. TICA will not issue any registration for cats born in Italy or bred under an Italian cattery name or by breeders residing in Italy, except as provided below.

Article 2. TICA will only issue a registration number to breeders stated in Article 1 upon request accompanied, for each cat to be registered, by an Italian registration certificate stating his name, sex and birth date and issued by a registration book officially recognized by the Italian Department of “Politiche Agricole e Forestali”. If the kitten is registered in the ENFI stud book, its pedigree status can be checked on-line on the ENFI web site, based on the cat's identification number.

The cat will receive a permanent TICA registration number only after submission of the Italian pedigree.

Article 3. Should a cat or kitten as in Art.1 be entered in a TICA show pending the registration process of Art.2 but before TICA has received his Italian registration certificate, the points gained in competition will become official only after the Italian registration certificate is received by TICA.

Article 4. TICA will not modify in any manner the registration of breeds appearing in the Italian certified pedigree: such pedigrees will be transcribed upon request into the TICA registration book subject to a control of genetic consistency of the data entered.

Article 5. In a spirit of cooperation, the scientific committees of both organizations will collaborate in their work aimed to the acceptance of jointly recognized breeds.

Part 2: Cat shows.

Article 6. Cat shows held by ENFI clubs and by TICA clubs can be held under the rules of ENFI and TICA respectively, simultaneously in the same show hall

Article 7. During these joint shows, traditional judging will be held under ENFI rules and American style judging will be held under TICA rules. If a joint show involves also clubs of other associations, each association will hold judging rings under its own rules. More generally, each club will operate its own show under its own rules. For shows held in Italy, additional exclusion rules imposed by the Italian laws may apply.

Article 8. Allbreed Judges of each organization will be eligible to be considered for acceptance as one-time guest judges in the other organization, subject to approval by the competent evaluation committees of those organizations.

Part 3: Recognition of TICA registrations.

Article 9 (breeds and colors recognized by ENFI). For cats registered in TICA, born outside of Italy and bred under a foreign cattery name by breeders not residing in Italy, the TICA “certified pedigree” (containing the data of the cat and of all its ancestors up to the 4th generation) will be recognized by ENFI and transcribed to the ENFI registration book, subject to a preliminary control of genetic consistency of the data entered, and with the understanding that only breeds, outcrosses and colors recognized by ENFI appear in the pedigree.

Article 10. For cats born in Italy, up to December 31st, 2016, upon request of the breeder, TICA “certified pedigrees” (containing the data of the cat and of all its ancestors up to the 4th generation) will be transcribed into the ENFI registration book, provided that they comply with the rules of Article 9.

Article 11 (breeds and colors not recognized by ENFI). For cats of all breeds not recognized by ENFI but included in the list of breeds approved by other worldwide associations at the date of March 2016, the same rules of Art.9 will apply, but the cats will be registered in ENFI’s experimental registry (“Registro Suppletore”) instead of the stud book. Moreover, the TICA breeds that are registered in the experimental registries of the other Italian genealogical books approved by the Italian Department will also be approved for registration in ENFI’s Registro Suppletore.

Part 4: Conciliation.

Article 12. In case of a conflict in the application of this agreement or a problem stemming from one of its articles, an arbitration committee mandated to solve the problem will be formed, consisting of a representative named by ENFI and one named by TICA. [note to Massimo and Damien - maybe we need a committee of 3 in case of deadlock?]

Article 13. In accordance with the spirit of cooperation governing the writing of the present agreement, each organization will support the shows of the other.

Article 14. This contract will become valid upon its signature by both parties. It is written in both English and Italian, the two texts having the same legal value.

Unfortunately we are losing Max as a breeder this coming year - but we are gaining Angela Sherzer from the SE Region and we hope to have a few more as well.

Two Mists have been shown to Supreme Grand Champion this year, and several others to other levels of grands - including Quad Grand. Three have earned Regional Awards - two as Alter Top 25 in SW and NW and one as a Top 25 SH Cat in the Northwest.

The requirement is that 10 individuals be shown in at least 15 rings and in 3 Regions. Mists have been extensively shown in the Northwest, Southwest and Europe West Regions. Some were shown in Southeast. One was also shown in Europe South (the Annual) and South Central and received several finals. Two were also shown in Great Lakes. There are a total of 2 kittens, 12 adults and three alters on the official scoring for the breed - for a total of 17. More were shown however - that did not defeat other cats and thus do not appear on those lists.

But in relation to the requirements - 16 cats on official scoring (one of the 17 was shown as both a whole cat and alter (10 required), The ring count is so far over that it is apparent, and Regions is 7 (requirement 3)

We are required to register 25 additional cats in the year. I have not gotten the reports from Lesley Jones (was Hart) - but the breeders have reported to me that they have registered an additional minimum of 20 in the US and perhaps an equal number in the UK.

I have requested copies of the computer readouts from Lesley.

We are also very excited that Dr. Truda Straede, the breed founder, is going to be coming to the Annual in San Diego and will be presenting the breed at the CEU in conjunction with the Annual.

Chausie Breed Report 2016
(3rd and final year in championship report)

This will be the last of our breed reports to the Board for the 3 probationary years after being accepted for Championship. I'm happy to report that the breed has again surpassed the requirements set by the TICA Board of Directors per the Registration Rules.

The Chausie breed achieves its first Lifetime Achievement award this year – LA IW SGA Tasurt Osiris (Osi) – once again achieving an International Win as TICA's 10th Best International Alter, owned and shown by Alex and Dasha Marinets, of Canada. Additionally breeders achieved Titles and Regional Awards in EW, MP, SW, NE, NW Regions for the 2015/2016 show season. Our top Kitten, Cat, and Alter are represented by 3 different catteries this year – Kitten, Halestone Jamie Lannister (SW), Cat, QGC Sonnenboume Anubis (EW), Alter, IW SGA Tasurt Osiris (NW).

There are 18 breed section members as of May 1, 2016 representing 10 different regions. (SW, SC, EN, SC, NW, EW, ES, MP, MA, SE).

56 individual Chausies were registered in 2015 and 42 have been registered between Jan 1 and April 30, 2016. 17 catteries are represented registering individual kittens or cats during that time frame.

Breed Section Members registering litters and individual cats are Halestone, Mike/Sandy Hale (SW), Tasurt, Bobbie Tullo (SW), Jinipenda, Shannon Ziokowski (SW), Sarsenstone, Cristy Bird (SW), Tribes, Judy Bender (SC), Willowind, Tammy Isaacs (SC), Marechal, Sheryl Koontz (MA), Leonardo, Liliya Garmashova (EN), Luxury Cats, Helena Sheremetieva (EN), Walhalla, Ewa Zgrabczynska (EN), Wildnorth, Stefan Milton/Carolina Wigren (EN), Sonnenblume, Jo Milnes (EW) Samhari, Sam Harrison (EW), Siroualba, Paula Harrison (ES) thus meeting the requirements for 5 active breeders in 3 different TICA Regions in the last 2 years.

There were 16 individual cats of the breed shown in a total of 41 shows (note; a show is considered a show regardless if it was 1day, 2 days or 3days). The regions shown in were NW, SW, EW, MP, NE, EN, MA, GL, SC, SE, NE.

The breed is continuing to grow and gain worldwide recognition with new breeders starting up. The Breed Committee continues to encourage breeders to register and show their cats in TICA.

Members of the breed group continue to send dna samples to Dr. William Murphy's team at TX A&M for testing. We are part of a fertility research - papers are starting to be published and they are getting closer to having a simple cheek swab test available for breeders to test kittens for fertility rather than growing them up and test breeding.

The Chausie breeders thank the TICA Board of Directors for their continued support of our breed.

The Highlander Breed Group Report: 2015-2016

Although the Highlander seems to be slowly gaining popularity as more people become interested in our breed, our breed section membership has declined a bit, we are now at 18 members.

Highlander Litter Registrations

In the 2015-16 TICA year there were 108 Highlander litters registered from 23 different catteries, which is a small increase to the counts registered in the prior year. Of these litters, 2 were 02T/V registered, 8 were 03T/V registered, 26 were A2 registered, none were A3 registered, 1 one AON registered, 28 were B3 registered, 1 was BO registered, 3 were C2 registered, 6 were C3 registered, 13 were CO registered, and 23 were SBT/V registered litters. These numbers demonstrate a progression of advancement in breed codes from the previous year, especially in SBT litter registrations which has more than doubled in number.

Individual Highlander Registrations

In the 2015-16 season there were a total of 118 Highlanders registered, showing a steady increase in individual registrations over the years. Of these individually registered kittens 6 were 02T/V, 12 were 03T/V, 26 were A2 registered, 1 was AON registered, 28 were B3 registered, 1 was BO registered, 6 were C3 registered, 13 were CO registered, and 23 were SBT/V. This again shows a significant progression in the codes that are required to qualify for Championship, particularly in the CO and SBT registrations.



Highlanders in the Show Hall

Sixteen unique Highlanders were shown in 12 different shows in 5 different regions, representing 7 different catteries in the 2015-16 show season. This is very similar to the numbers we saw in the previous show season.



Summary

In review, other than the decline in breed section membership, the Highlander breed has remained stable or continued to grow in every aspect that is monitored. The breed section members who remain are dedicated to working toward the required goals to achieve Championship status. We are particularly encouraged at seeing more Highlanders in the show hall. Our focus remains geared toward improving the type and consistency in our breed so that we are producing cats that represent the written standard. This continues to be the hardest, but most crucial part of creating a new breed. We are excited about the progress we have already made, and are looking forward to watching our Highlanders continue to develop over the next few years.

FROM THE HISTORY OF RUSSIAN FELINOLOGY

TOY-BOB. BEAUTIFUL BREED WARTS AND ALL

BREED HISTORY



2015

We came from the regular International cat exhibition. And as always, our little daughter meet us with words: "Show me favours and cups!! Let's hang them on the wall and admire them!" We take our favours out. They are different and unique on each exhibition. We hung up our awards and my eye accident-ly lighted on the very first favour of ours. And incidental memory awakened...

THE VERY BEGINNING...

In 1983 I picked up Siamse cat (as I thought back there) in the street, which was skinny, sick and dirty, and I brought it home. We washed it, started to cure, feed and care for that cat. We gave him the name - Mishka. he had a quite big muzzle, severe character, rather short tail, which was broken in four. Those days we were far away from the felinology science (actually, there was no



such science in the USSR), and I thought that I have the very thoroughbred Siamese Royal cat. Only later, in many years time I understood that our Mishka is simply Siamese colored cat.

January 1985.

There was a snowy cold winter. My Mum was coming back from work, when suddenly something fell down on her chest, held hard onto her coat's collar and started purring loudly. Thoughts raced through her head immediately: "Who's this? What's this? If it's purring, then it's possibly a cat...". And it actually appeared to be a cat. Not a simple cat, but Siamese cat, except it was small and with strange tail. "Royal one! Now Mishka will have a wife.." my Mum assumed, put it in her bosom and ran back home quickly.



We started observing her in greater detail. Rather small head, thin body, spinal column is available to count and the tail is very interesting in the shape of bagel. We started pronouncing different names, when our skydiver reacted with "Meow" on the name Simka.

Sweet couple lived together happily, and apparently loved each other. After mating season cute kittens were born and we had a lot of those who wanted to become the owners of "Royal Siamese". So for several years we gave away presented our kittens.

In 1998

Simka gave birth to the regular litter of 3 kittens. one of them was twice smaller than his peers and had a tiny tail, that is there was a small bob instead of tail. That was the first time we saw anything like that. So far we had different tails including rather short and a little longer but always with several kinks. Though that baby had a tiny tiny tail. There was no hesitation about the name - Kutsiy (rus. for "dock-tailed").

Kittens were growing, while our little one was growing very slowly, his litter mates were twice larger. He differed from the others not only by size but by his total appearance. Large round eyes, almost square shape of body. And his behavior was not "cat-alike".

He walked with me along



the boulevard running a little ahead devotedly looking at me with his large blue eyes, where you could see the words: "Am I doing everything right? I am very obedient, I am not running away! Please, praise me!". No passer-by could avoid asking a question: "What's the breed of your dog?" Imagine their amazement after hearing that it was a cat. But of which breed?..

1989. We are going to the cat exhibition which is the first one for us and for Kutsiy indeed. From the introduction speech we learnt that organizers of the exhibition arrived from Dnepropetrovsk (which became CFC "Alisa" afterwards and helped us to arrange advertising exhibits in Rostov-on-Don).



It was announced that the winner was to be the cat which collected the largest quantity of admission tickets left in their cage be the visitors. And naturally breed definition and expertise were assumed to appear. There came our turn. Firstly they ought to have defined the breed. Experts were examining Kutsiy, whispering and giggling with one another when they finally delivered verdict: Siamese minicat.

Although looking it up through the whole encyclopedia, experts could not find the breed with such name. Then someone assumed that it is a kitten and we mixed something up with the date of birth, therefore it is simply Siamese cat without the prefix "mini". That was our first "expertise".

By the end of the second day there was the announcement of results. to our complete surprise Kutsiy got the second place and made to the top three. We were overfilled with happiness! We were the winners, spectators loved us!

Our second exhibition took place on the 27-28 of October 1990. And the same question again: "Why did you bring a kitten?". that was about the same cat Kutsiy, that already was 2,5 years old. During examination we were told that there is no such breed in the cat-ologue, therefore that breed does not exist. "If you manage to breed the female to your boy, then you will have miniature



breed." — they said.

Kutsiy decided to solve that genetic problem himself. When Simka (his mother) started asking for a cat our gentleman could not refuse to the lady... That is how in two months we got posterity of 4 kittens — 3 sons and one daughter. She was the smallest and with curved tail. Is it the future girlfriend for Kutsiy? We named the tiny cat Puma and left her live with us. The rest "Royal Siamese" were presented again.

1992. CFC "Skif", which had opened not so long ago arranged first evaluative cats' exposition in Rostov-on-Don. It was not too large - about 20-25 exhibitors (comparing with today's scope, that was not even the exhibition but a club's "get-together").

The head of the club Irina Sidorenko introduced an expert from Saint Petersburg Galina Batkova. After we were invited, I came with both Kutsiy and Puma, put them on the table and I saw the silent question in the expert's eyes "Who are they?" answering immediately: "These are Let's put the word "Thai"

from the couple of siamese-colored cats"... After one-minute conversation with the head of the club G.K.Batkova asked me to bring and show the parents if possible.

After long and silent examination of Mishka and Simka she asked to show Kutsiy and Puma again. She also examined them for a long time, writing and drawing something. Then she thanked us and asked to stay after the exposition for a conversation.

— I wonder how it is possible for not even average but large cats to give birth to that Kutsiy. Furthermore, you also got such a small girl. You should keep working, what if it is actually our future breed that will conquer all the world!.. How shall we name that breed? We must already think of it.

At once we have decided that there should be the word "Don" in the name, as we are from Rostov-on-Don. Then Irina Sidorenkova reminded that the experiment had officially started in the club "Skif", while Galina Konstantinovna suggested that "we were brought up from cats looking like Thai ones".

and we get "Skif-thai-don". she also told us she made some draft of preliminary standards and that she was going to tell about our Rostov's wonder to other experts in Saint-Petersburg.

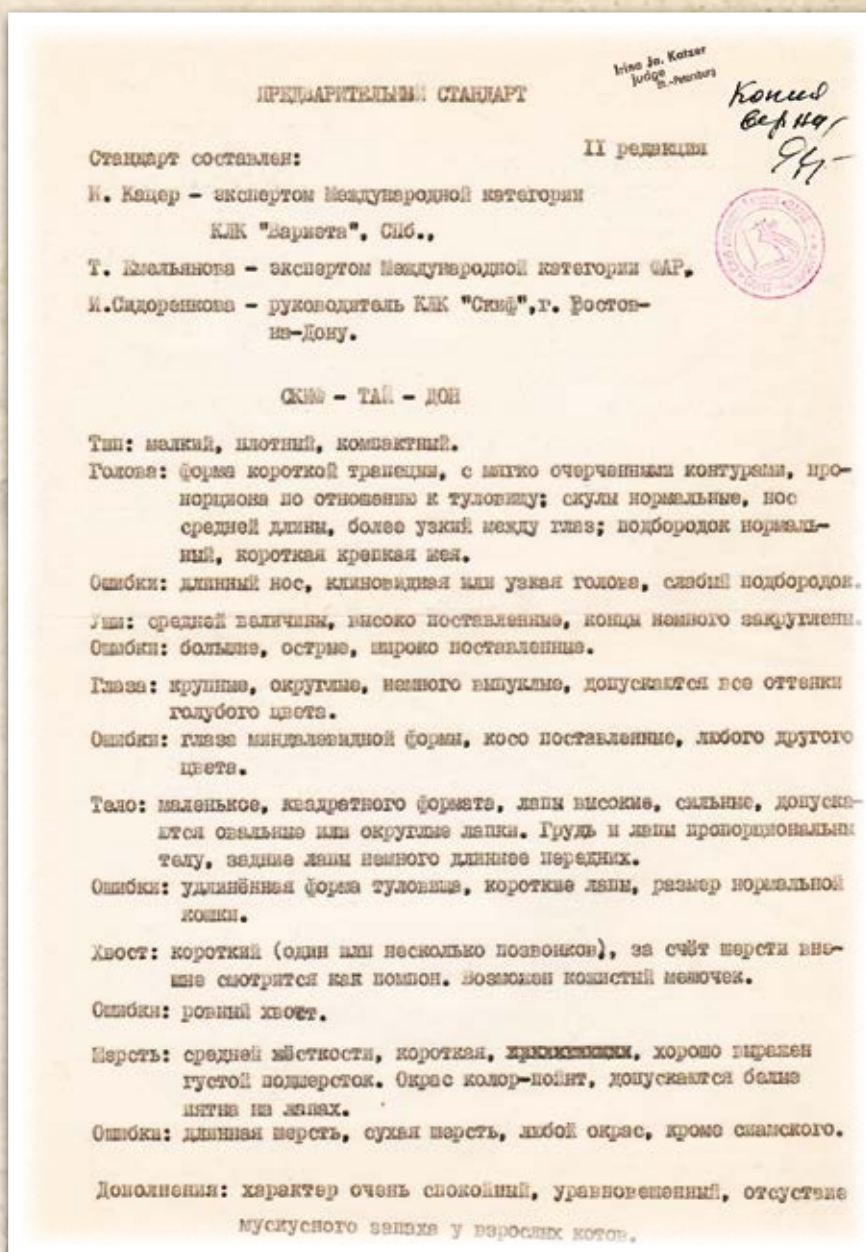
adult cats which were born

In the spring of 1993 CFC is organizing their second exposition where the number of cats is twice higher - nearly 50, which is considered as a very large exhibition those days. Here we met I.Nemyikina (she was the one who started the development of Russian hairless breed - Don Sphinx). She introduced me to the expert I.Katser. Irina YAKovlevna studied my cats with intense interest, I.Sidorenkova showed the standards' sketch made by Batko-va on the previous exposition. Having studied the notes,

I.Katser and I.Sidorenkova composed the standard of experimental breed - Skif-thai-don. In the end we got the invitation to the exhibition in Saint Petersburg and were asked to show our cats (Skif-thai-don and Russian hairless) there.

On that exposition I.Katser introduced us to Tamara Semenovna YEmelyanova who was internationally certified expert. I can still remember it very well - empty hall, the light is on only over the scene, where there is a table with Kutsiy and Puma on. And two internationally certified experts - I.Katser and T.YEmelyanova studying them correct the standards

written in Rostov-on-Don.

Two weeks after Saint Petersburg we went to the exhibition in Kharkov. The expertise were made by the famous geneticist-felinologist I.V.SHustrova. Having studied preliminary standard, Irina Vladimirovna started to examine Kutsiy and Puma with keen interest. and suddenly Kutsiy uttered his famous "oww". Everyone were taken aback!



Of course it was not the dog's "bow-wow", but when our babies play with one another or when they like something, they produce peculiar sound which are not likely to be heard from cats. "Very interesting! and I like these pets as well", - noted Irina Vladimirovna. - Let's collaborate together with Irina Kartser and plan future programme on breeding your cats. I also met I.S.Hustrova several times afterwards and was consulted on breeding.

At the beginning of November 1993 me and **T. S. Y E m e l y a n o v a** recieved an invitation to the First International exposition of Russian cat breeds. it was written all about this event, our cats were shown on TV throughout our country, futhermore, Reuters agency gave the report of that all over the world in the news. I.Nemyikina still have note from the "Moskovskiy komsomolyets" (one of the most popular Russian newspapers):

"**FAR** (Felinological Assossiation of Russia) through has hold The first exposition of Russian cat breeds. this event took place on Noviy Arbat in the city hall of Moscow next to the White House, still unrepaired and sooty... Being tired of commotions the people went into the city hall, which windows are still barred withplywood. Whole families has come for the sake of quiet plesure and joy that they get from communication with our Russian purrs. Dads were strongly impressed by

Bobtails that were brought from the Kurile irelands to Moscow for the first time. Ladies were amazed by Russian hairless - bald Sphynx. there are only three such cats that live in Rostov-on-Don. Kids could not go away from caves with Skof-thai-don cats - the breed that had been developed recently...

My cats had never seen such a large amount experts studying them with so intense interest. We have had the WCF-expertise from O.S.Potekhina, E.E.Morozova, M.V.Putilina. And above all, first professional photos of our cats were taken.

Time moved along, our couple was having posterity.

almost each litter had small kittens and larger ones. The point that was uppermost for us at birth was a tail. You never now what kind you would get. There was almost no identical tails. (Untill now when the kitten has just been born we look at the tail first, and than at the gender.)

Lifestock of the nursery "KUTS" was increasing and the number of people who wanted to get kittens of the new "mini-breed" was growing as well. We explained that the kittens who were born in breeding are not given away absolutely for free as pets. Nothing but size was the difference between them

Geography of During the period from 1993 to 1999 geography of our cats had expanded significantly, people arrived from all over the country to take our kittens away. Purebred cats left to Moscow, S.Petersburg, Kiev, Kaunas, Krasnodar, Irkutsk, Perm, Kharkov, Sevastopol, Donetsk, Pervouralsk, Berdyansk, Chelyabinsk, G o m e l ,

Krasnoufimsk, Magnitogorsk, Astrakhan...

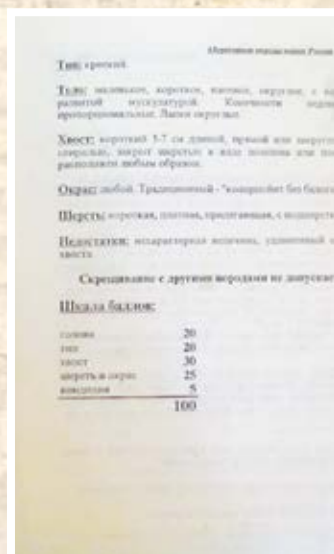
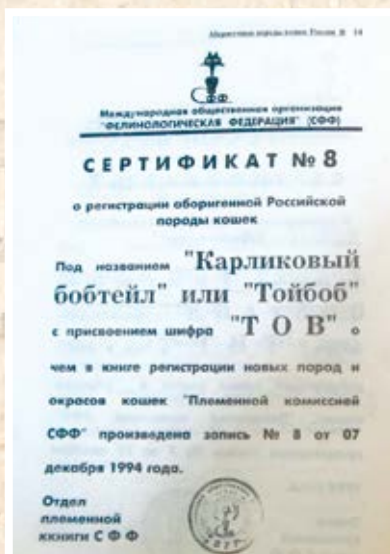
In December 1994

regular stock-breeders` and experts` seminar took place. 57 specialists of top felinological organisations from Russia, Belarus and Ukraine from 21 cat fanciers` clubs participated there. Standards on Russian native breeds, including ours, were approved on that meeting. Our standard was composed and introduced by O.S.Mironova, who had also changed our complicated name

of breed into pithy and emphatic TOY-BOB.

The standard on Thai Bobtail, which is nowadays called Mekong Bobtail, was presented on the same conference. L.K. Yesina conducted pioneer formation of this breed.

In 2008 Ludmila Konstantinovna called me and we talked for a long time, we discussed the procedure of official acceptance of Toy-bob, how and where to start. She told me that she really wanted Mekongs to have the same prominent eyes as Toy-bobs have, she set up a lot of experiments with my, but larger cats, who arrived particularly from my house, as they were not left for breeding. But she had not managed to realise that idea, so she left it afterwards. However, it is interesting that now in Mekongs` litter small kittens appear. Those come from sides with my cats` blood...



...A lot of events had happened within more than three decades, they were pleasant and not really, those that made us laugh and those that hurt as so deeply. There can be a whole book about it and the breeders actually have such intentions. Perhaps Toybob fanciers will be able to read the story without any contractions. After all, analysing the facts, we can see that Kutsiy was born almost at the same time as Russian felinology was born

And finally look at his date of birth - 8.8.1988. The symbol of these numbers is ∞ — infinity...

SIMILAR BUT DIFFERENT

COMPARISON OF STANDARTS BETWEEN MEKONG BOBTAIL AND TOY-BOB CAT BREEDS

Toy-bob and Mekong Bobtail seem to be similar breeds. Both are short-tailed color-pointed and come from somewhere in the 90th. When demonstrated apart from each other, people, sometimes even experts, can ask: "What's the difference?" The reason of such doubts is in small livestock of those breeds in comparison with other breeds. However, Mekong Bobtail has already passed their peak of popularity, whereas Toy-bob is only at the beginning of their recognition in different systems, even though both breeds are well-known in Russian felinology for almost 25 years.

However, after seeing these two cats together, all questions disappear. The differences between two breeds are as obvious as those of British Shorthair and Russian Blue cats. First of all, it is the size: even adults, considering their name ("toy"), almost twice smaller than their peers, including Mekongs. The size of the adult Toy-bob equals the size of 5-6 month old Mekong bobtail.

We have two breeds: Toy-bob and Mekong Bobtail. Each breed has developed on its own way. Mekong Bobtail is short tailed representative of South-Eastern and Central Asia, and Near East cats' population, which has obtained its recognition in Russia. Whilst Toy-bob is completely Russian breed from Rostov-on-Don, created by the breeder E. Krasnichenko.

The next question is about the tail - what is the difference?

Mekong's tail is short and has unique form - it can have the shape of rose, chrysanthemum or just like pom-pom, and the way they wag those tails is very cute and funny. ASC-SuperCats standards describe that tail as composed of irregular kinks, knots or curves in any

combinations. It is obligatory kinked or curved at the base (first vertebrae) and flexible. The tail consists of at least 3 vertebrae and visible length is not longer then 1/4 body's length."

Requirements to the Toy-bob's tail are not so strict, but according to ASC Standards their tail is flexible, preferably is composed of several kinks and curves in any

combination, but may be also almost straight. There are not less than vertebrae. Visible length is not longer then 1/3 of the body length."

Which means that Mekong's tail cannot be straight as opposed to Toy-bob's tail.

But for both breeds having a tail is a necessity! What is more, the tail must have at least 3 vertebrae - that is extremely important for bobtails. Those requirements are related to cats' health - the absence of Manx gene. Having this gene is only possible for Manx and for semi-longhair kind of Manx - Cymric, which was bred as a result of natural mutation. Faulty breeding can cause dangerous consequences for the posterity. Therefore all of the international felinological systems fit short hair cats have the requirement of having the tail with at least minimum number of vertebrae.

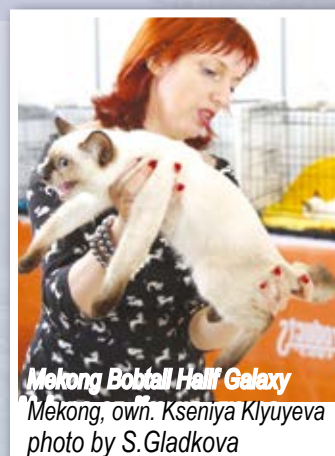
Different tail shapes and length for Toy-bob

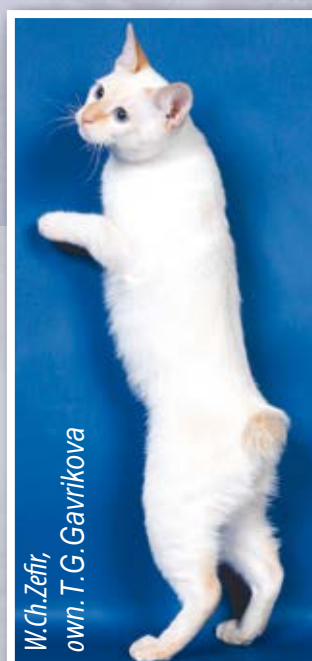

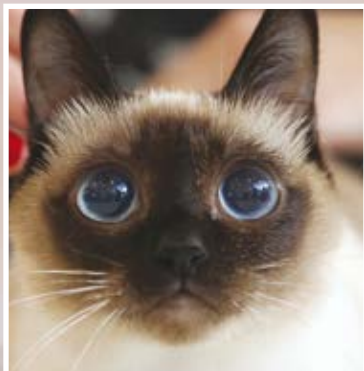
HEAD

Shape: Short trapezium shape with gently rounded contours.

Cheekbones: medium, rounded, clearly defined

Muzzle: short, rounded, without pinch.

Forehead: Rather full.



Profile: Distinctly curved profile with a dip from the forehead to the nose at the eye-middle level. Definite stop is not allowed.

Nose: Nose is medium in length. Bridge of the nose is straight or slightly curved.

Chin: strong



Shape: medium in length with oval contours. The top of the head is slightly flat.

Cheekbones: rather high. In males can be more developed and broader.

Muzzle: oval with whisker break

Forehead: almost flat, with soft transition at eye brows level to flat top of the head

Profile: curved with the dip below the eye level

Nose: roman nose in form of a smooth arc from the transition to the tip of the nose. Medium in length, uniformly broad throughout its length.

Chin: strong, forms a vertical line with the tip of the nose



Comparing breeds we can see that Toy-bob has rounded head with short muzzle, rather full forehead, distinct curve to the nose with straight or

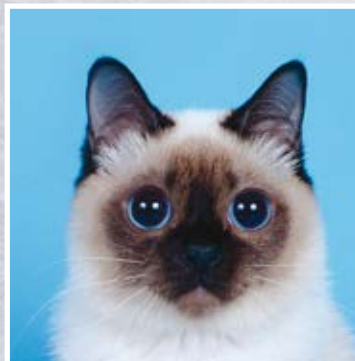
slightly curved bridge. Whereas Mekong has snake shaped head with oval contours, forehead and the top of the head are almost flat, must be curved with the dip below the

eye level. The very important feature of Mekong's head is "the Roman nose", that is having the form of a smooth arc from transition to the top of the nose.

EARS

Shape: medium sized, with rounded tips.

Placement: High set. Slightly tilted forward. The distance between the ears is no more than one ear width.



Shape: large, broad at the base, with slightly rounded tips.

Placement: set rather high, no more than one ear width apart. Slightly tilted forward. The outer edge set slightly back.

EYES

Shape: large, open wide, almost round, very expressive.

Color: intense deep blue

Shape: large, oval, set almost straight

Color: blue, the deeper the better

Both breeds have large expressive eyes, however Toy-bobs have round eyes, whereas Mekongs have oval ones.

Comparatively large ears of Mekongs are in harmony with ovals of their heads, whilst Toy-bobs has medium sized and high set ears.

Both breeds do not have large size. Though Toy-bob cats are considered small in particular. After birth they weigh about 40-50 grams and their size in adulthood twice or half again smaller than

Mekong's. Weight of adult Toy-bobs is about 2 kg, while Mekongs weigh up to 3-4 kg.

Toy-bob's body is square, short and solid, whereas Mekong's one is rectangular, muscular, but yet slender and balanced. Toy-bobs, especially males, distinguish themselves having short, almost wrestler's neck.

In spite of the fact that the color of the breeds is the same - color pointed without white (Toy-bobs can only have seal-pointed version), texture and structure of the coat differs. While Mekong's coat is almost without undercoat, Toy-bobs are likely to have one, what is more the topcoat is nearly as long as the

coat. The structure of Toy-bob's coat is not close lying, but Mekong's is crispy.

Point scale of ASC is approximately identical for both breeds. Though, form of the body and bone structure of Mekongs (10 points) is less important than those of Toy-bobs. Mekongs' tail, on the other hand, its form and length are extremely valuable - 20 points (as opposed of 10 points for Toy-bob) However, the one thing, that do not depend on any systems and standards, and that is absolutely the same for our colorno cats is their character! Both of them are very sociable, friendly, clever, curious, active, they like to communicate with people, as well as with other animals. Those who are lucky enough to live with such cat are conquered with their deep blue eyes, small tail and incredible charm.

IMPORTANT

Reference. Standard of Toy-bob cat is recognized by ASC- SuperCats and four other systems after examination of the livestock of 50 cats' pedigree, whose origins are from Rostov breeding line. Standard of the Mekong bobtail is only described in advance.

MINIATURE BREED IS GREAT AND HEALTHY!

THE BREED

Emergence of cats with different peculiarities is a standard phenomenon, the gift of nature. However to notice that feature, civilize it, to grow up several generations, to gather a group of like-minded people who would love such cats and who are ready to popularize them, increase the livestock, to reach the acceptance of cats' systems, is a very hard work of the breeder indeed. We know some breed examples who had arisen but then disappeared in oblivion. Toy-bobs were lucky as their "Mum" Elena Krasnichenko went through that difficult way from Mishka and Kutciy to the acceptance of the breed.



THE FIRST BREEDERS AND THE FIRST PEDIGREES



A quarter of century ago a cats` family arisen at Elena Krasnichenko`s and her mother`s home in Rostov-on Don. There was Mishka, who was a small cat with shortened and curved tail, and color-pointed cat Simka with shortened tail as well, but twisted as bagel.

When in 1988 in a regular litter a very small kitten appeared Elena had some hesitations about his health. As he was twice smaller his congeners she wondered if he was full-term and if he was going to survive. besides the size he differed from the others by his tiny tail in the shape of bob, huge eyes and even the character which was more doggy than catlike.

The baby was named Kutciy. He was rather small well timbered cat and became the father of the breed toy bobtails — Toy-bobs. the cats nursery of E.Krasnichenko has been called “KUTC” in his honor.

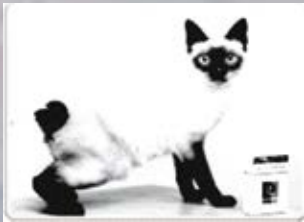

The work on cultivating the breed and raising the livestock started in 1988. Every careless step, each unbred mating could have led to culling the whole generation. For the felinological work you can easily apply the quote from the movie "The Irony of fate" (very popular film in Russia): "Within one night you

can easily destroy the old, but to build something new is extremely difficult".

The kids of small size, with a little surprised sight of blue eyes, mask at the muzzle and shortened tail stayed in breeding. The weight of newborn Toy-bobs is about 40-50 grams. As opposed to rising the kittens of other

breeds, rising up Toy-bobs requires much more attention.

The first matter taken up with breeders must be the health among different mutative features. There are three main breed features such as small size, shortened tail and Siamese color.



Toy-bobs are the usual kids, they are playful, curious, very active and agile and... small.

MINIATURE IS NOT A DWARFISM

There is nothing unusual in the birth of cats of small size. If we take the examples from wild nature we can find the number of prototype there. Miniature animals is not a dwarfism as some people assume, but a proportionally to a "large prototype" downsized types, which has found their proper place within in the natural selection conditions (usually a different type, breed).

No-one is surprised but moved by small African hedgehog whose weight is about 350-500 g, that is four times lighter than his congeners in hedgehog family.

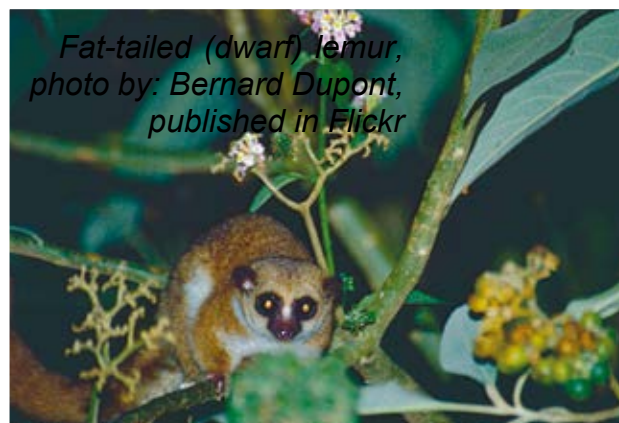
Or Fennec fox which is the smallest animal in dog family. Shoulder height of that fox is only 18-22 cm, body length does not exceed 40 cm., and the maximum weight is one and a half kg.

Mini-monkey or Marmoset is the smallest monkey on Earth. Adult's weight is 120 g maximum and the length is 8 cm. Platyrrhine monkeys of Marmoset family inhabit in the forests of South America, Brasil, Peru, Ecuador.

The other representative of mini-animals is an amazing fat-tailed (dwarf) lemur, which is distributed in the west and south of Madagascar. His head and body length is about 20 to 23 cm, and tail length is about 20-27 cm. the body weight is ranged between 120

and 270 g and reaches its maximum before hibernation.

Among the wild cat race the smallest is a rusty (red)-spotted cat. It is one of the Asian cats genus and is a close relation of Bengali cat, both of them inhabit only in India and Sri-Lanka. By the way, it is not red literary, but its short hair is gray with red or rusty spots on the back and sides. Body length is 35-48 cm, hair length is 15-30 cm, weight of the adult is only 0,9-1,6 kg. Therefore she is one of the smallest wild cats in the world.

In the world of purebred cats Singapura had been considered the smallest before Toy-bobs appeared.

Miniature breeds of animals are over the top nowadays. They play the role of a fashion accessory or an expensive life toy

Where there's demand, there's supply. Therefore chasing more exotics and fragility some unscrupulous breeders obtain not miniature but dwarf animals.

Unfortunately, while working over Toy-bob breed, some breeders, being not scrupulous enough, haven't cared about saving the unique appearance of those cats, but made a lot of experiments not having examined their

kittens on genetic defects. Fashionable name, exotic "toy", what else is important?

In the cynological world the situation is very similar. Decreasing height and weight of healthy dogs is not so simple process. Puppies in regular litter are generally born the same size as their parents or even a little larger. Chasing extremely low weight some unscrupulous breeders build up their work on mating large and healthy female with dwarf male not taking into account their compatibility and possible hereditary diseases leading to the nursing's death.

Dwarf animals suffer from following pathologies:

- *Hydrocephalus symptoms, such as excessively large head in comparison with body.*
- *Unhealed fontanel which stays open the whole life.*
- *Hernia which sometimes lead to open abdominal cavity.*
- *Joint problems.*
- *Imperfect tooth system - overshot or undershot bite, absence of incisor teeth, no tooth enamel.*
- *sparse hair caused by thyroid gland dysfunction.*
- *Underdevelopment of the visceral organs.*
- *As a rule, short age of life.*

Miniature animals are as we have mentioned earlier, are animals (usually another type/breed) which were downsized proportionally to a "large prototype", but without any extreme, brought by a human.

SHORTENED TAIL: VARIETY OF SHAPE

Description of Toy-bob's tail: "minimum length is 5 cm, must not extend past a stretched hindhock; flexible, curves are acceptable" (TICA standard).

To sum up we can say that even short tails can have the variety of shape and length, flexibility and quantity of curves. The short tail does not disturb any of those natural breeds to live healthy life, except total absence of one.

So the short tail of our Rostov lusty children Toy-

Not moving away towards wild cats' world, where lynx is the brightest representative of short-tailed, we can consider different forms of tails of thoroughbred congeners.

American Bobtail's tail is described as "short, flexible and expressive and may be straight, slightly curved or slightly kinked or have bumps along the length of the tail, must not to extend past a stretched hind hock in length Tail to be broad at base, strong. Straighter tails should exhibit a fat pad at the end of the tail" (CFA standard).

Our "compatriot" Kurillian Bobtail has more habitual for sight short tail with stronger restrictions: "the tail is kinked

and/or curved, with one or more kinks in any combination. The length (without furnishing) is between 3 and 8 cm. The fur on the tail is longer than on the rest of the body. (WCF standard).

bobs serves to show their beauty and harmony. Being attentive enough in breeding able to dismiss the possibility to shorten the tail until it's gone you can do no harm to the animals' health.

SIAMESE COLOUR: MAGIC AND PROBLEMS

Aboriginal Siamese cats were the result of mutation in the full color C gene. Well-known English biologist and geneticist has written that "One of the first mutation a long time ago was the appearance of black color". Therefore all variety of colors existed nowadays is the result of fixed natural mutations of very familiar with everybody wild agouti color.

Siamese or Himalayas color is always the result of recessive cs gene work. It is a heat sensitive gene, which suppresses the activity of color ferment according to the body temperature. The lower the temperature, the more active is this gene. Consequently, the higher the temperature, the lower the effect is.

Which explains why a Siamese has dark extremities such as the face (so-called mask), ears, tail and legs. Those shades should be colored as even as possible. Siamese cats are white at birth, with pink foot-pads and noses, this is due to being in the constant warmth of the mothers womb. The shade color comes out in a few days as a thin line at the age of ears, then on nose edge, foot-pads and tail.

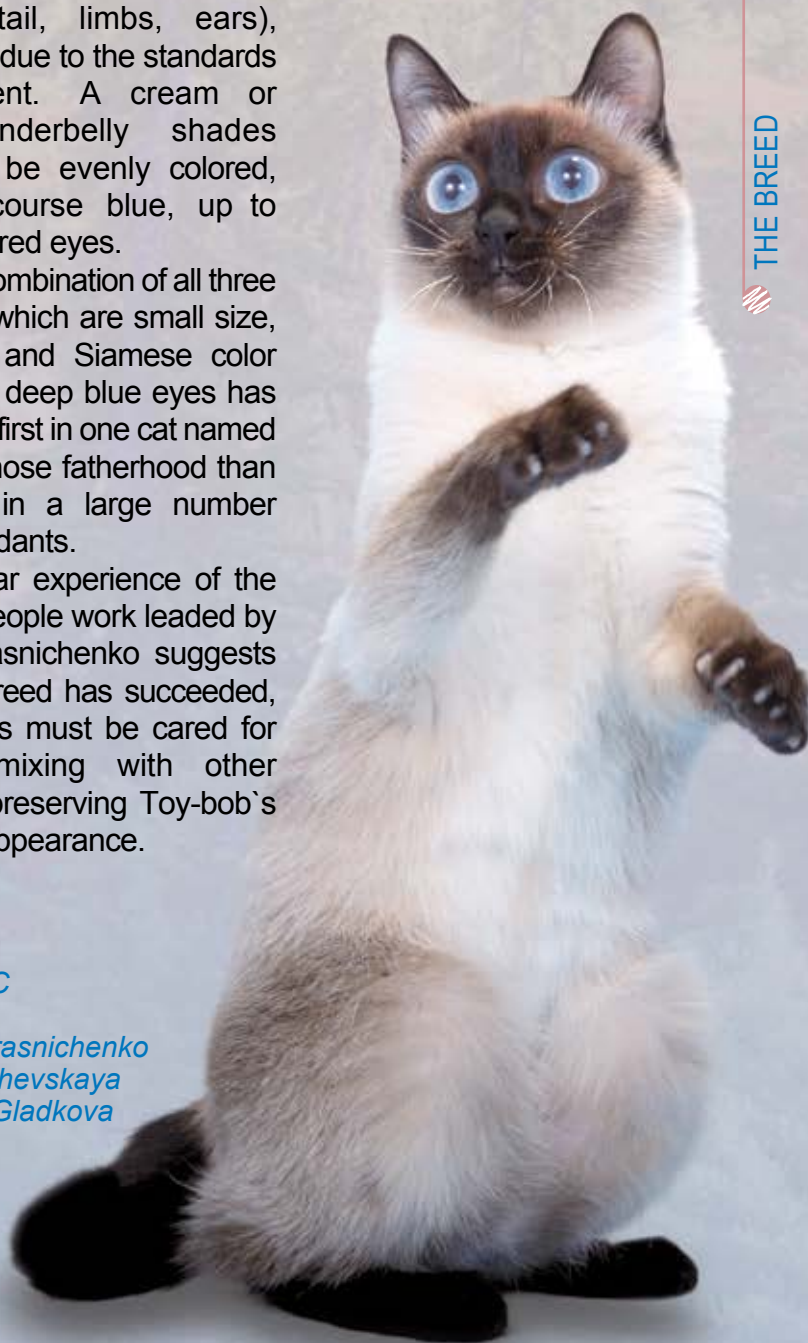
All cats of Toy-bob breed are Siamese colored and get darker with age. It is a natural process, so you cannot call it a problem. The uppermost for those colors is to have high-contrast mask and points (tip of tail, limbs, ears), which is due to the standards requirement. A cream or white underbelly shades ought to be evenly colored, and of course blue, up to violet-colored eyes.

The combination of all three qualities, which are small size, short tail and Siamese color with large deep blue eyes has appeared first in one cat named Kutciy, whose fatherhood than occurred in a large number of descendants.

25-year experience of the party of people work led by Elena Krasnichenko suggests that the breed has succeeded, and that is must be cared for without mixing with other species, preserving Toy-bob's peculiar appearance.

Toy-bobs has become the cherry on the cake in different expositions, the standards are accepted in five felinological systems. And that is not even a limit...

THE BREED

ASC` STANDARD OF TOY-BOB – (TOB)

GENERAL

Appearance: Cats of small size, short body with strong bone structure, broad chest and short neck. Well-muscled. Back is almost straight. Legs are rather strong. Shortened tail. Only sealpoint color.

Size: small sized, adult's cats preferred weight is less then 2 kg. Males can be little larger than females.

THE HEAD

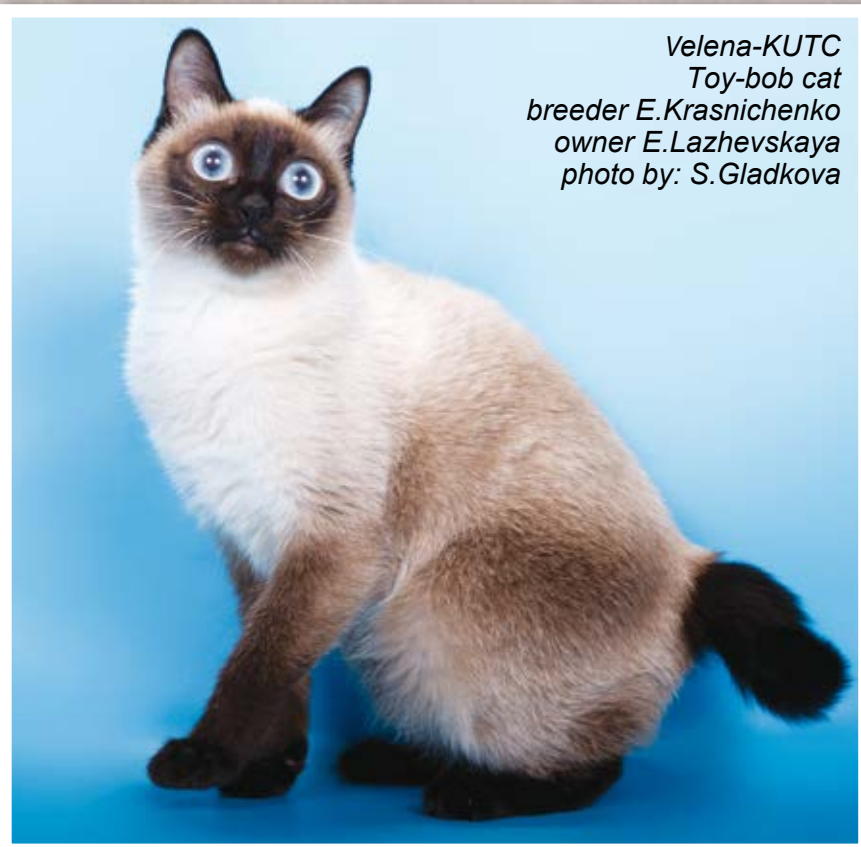
Shape: Short trapezium shape with gently rounded contours.

Forehead: Rather full.

Profile: Distinctly curved profile with a dip from the forehead to the nose at the eye-middle level. Definite stop is not allowed.

Nose: Nose is medium in length. Bridge of the nose is straight or slightly curved.

Short and powerful neck

Chin: strong.

Cheekbones: medium, rounded, clearly defined.

Muzzle: short, rounded, without pinch.

EYES

Shape: large, open wide, almost round, very expressive.

Color: intense deep blue

EARS

Shape: medium sized, wide in the base, with rounded tips.

Placement: High set. Slightly tilted forward. The distance between the ears is no more then one ear width.

BODY

Neck: short, powerful.

Body structure: square, smaller then medium size, compact, short, solid, muscular.

Rib cage: broad. The back is almost straight.

Back: almost straight.

Sexual dimorphism is not very pronounced.

LEGS:

Strong, medium in length, hind legs slightly longer than forelegs.

Paws: rounded, with elongated fingers on hind legs.



TAIL:

Flexible, preferably is composed of several kinks and curves in any combination, but may be also almost straight. There are not less than 3 vertebrae. Visible length is not longer than 1/3 of the body length.

COAT:

Structure: short, dense, resilient, not close lying, with developed undercoat. The topcoat is slightly longer than the undercoat.

Colour: seal-point only. Evenness of the body color and contrast with the points are more important than whiteness.

Point Colour: dense and even. Mask, ears, feet and tail should match in seal

TEMPER:

Active, sociable, curious, calm and even-tempered, like to communicate with people and other animals.

FAULTS

Head: wedge-shaped or narrow head; weak chin; pointed or elongated muzzle. Incorrect bite; too slight dip in profile; stop.

Eyes: almond shaped, any color, except blue. **Ears:** big, pointed, wide set.

Body: not typical body size, too elegant or frail, elongated.

Coat: too silky coat, plushy coat.

FAULTS PRECLUDING THE CERTIFICATE

Head: straight profile

Body: any changes of type suggesting outcrosses with other breeds

Tail: longer than 1/3 of the body length, less than 2-3 vertebrae, lack of tail, inflexible tail

Coat: long or semi-long, any coat colour except seal-point, dark painted to the roots areas on the belly or chest white spots and lockets

DISQUALIFICATION

Aggressiveness and other general disqualifying features: Strabismus, long coat.


The Lykoi(LY) breed group is writing a letter of intent for the advancement of the Lykoi from Advanced New Breed status to Championship status at the Annual meeting August 31-September 2, 2016. We request that the TICA Board advance the status of the Lykoi(LY) to Championship status based on the following statements:

1. Our total group has 24 breeders worldwide in the TICA breed group. We cover ten TICA regions. Each breeder has produced a litter in the last two years. Each breeder is dedicated to outcrossing with black domestic shorthair to aid in the genetic diversity of the breed. Each breeder plans to continue breeding Lykoi in the future.
2. We are asked monthly by other people if they can become breeders. We are not placing breeding animals with new breeders at this time since we are all trying to build our own and each other's breeding program.
3. We currently have 228 cats registered that are 8 months or older. There are 67 Lykoi that are show standard over 8 months old and can be shown as Advanced New Breed or in Championship. We have also registered many other kittens that are less than 8 months old at the time of submission. Over 28 of the younger kittens are show standard and will be eligible to be shown in Championship.
4. We have had 34 cats shown at the Advanced New Breed level in the past year. Many have been shown at multiple shows in both the Preliminary New Breed and the Advanced New Breed. We have attended a total of 75 shows over the last two years. Thirty eight (38) of the shows have been at the Advanced New Breed level.
5. Our cats have been judged by 125 judges. Many of these judges have shown a great interest in our cats and their development. Many of the judges look for the day the Lykoi can be judged against other cats in the Championship class.
6. To date, the Lykoi are still proving to us that they are a strong, healthy breed. There is very little health concerns.
7. The interest in the Lykoi is still growing. We currently have a combined total of over 30,000 fans on face book pages. We have had over 100 news articles published on the internet, many television mentions, and continual request for the Lykoi to appear at cat show(TICA as well as other registries) and pet expos. The amount of people that attend as spectators at events increase if there is news that a Lykoi is present. The waiting list for all the breeders is increasing weekly with people wanting to be pet owners, exhibitors, or breeders of the Lykoi.

8. Other cat registries have commented on their interest for the Lykoi to reach championship status. They look forward to the day that the Lykoi could be transferred to their registry for their shows.
9. Each breeder and show home has dedicated their time and resources to help ensure that the Lykoi remain a healthy, popular breed for TICA and the public.
10. We have exceeded in the requirements needed for TICA to advance us to Championship status.
11. The research teams at the universities have published dermatological reviews of the Lykoi compared to human hair studies. There is more work for isolating the gene and identification should occur in the very near future.



Name of Breed: Lykoi (LY)

33.8 Championship Status Requirements. An Advanced New Breed may apply for Championship Status upon completion of the following:

33.8.1 At least 1 year has passed since the breed was first advanced to Advanced New Breed status. The Board of Directors at its discretion may reduce the time required of Transfer New Breed.

Date (meeting) advanced to ANB: September 2-4, 2015

33.8.2 A minimum of 200 adults registered in any full member association of the World Cat Congress (WCC) of which a minimum of 50 are registered in TICA at a level potentially eligible for championship competition.

Attach Addendum A.

33.8.3 List of at least 35 shows licensed by WCC organizations of which at least 10 must be TICA shows where cats have been exhibited, including region/countries and judges. A Show shall be defined as a "show catalog" for this purpose.

Attach Addendum B.

33.8.4 List of 25 unique individual cats that have been shown, including registration numbers (code + six digits) and region/countries shown.

Attach Addendum C.

33.8.5 List of judges who have judged the breed.

Attach Addendum D.

33.8.6 A minimum of 5 regions are represented by a minimum of fifteen breeders who are TICA members in good standing actively breeding the breed.

Attach Addendum E.

33.8.7 At least 25 unique cats shown in the Advanced New Breed Class including entries shown in at least five regions during the year preceding the application.

Attach Addendum F.

33.8.8 Submission of an electronic Application for Advancement to Championship to each member of the Genetics Committee and each member of the Rules Committee at least 90 days prior to the board meeting at which approval is sought. Any proposed modifications to a previously approved standard must be submitted with the application. Following approval of the proposal by the Genetics Committee and Rules Committee, the application must be submitted by the ANB Working Group Chair to the TICA Executive Office at least 60 days prior to the Board Meeting for inclusion in the agenda. Any comments of the Genetics Committee or Rules Committee must be included. The application must include the following: (applications available from the TICA Executive Office or at tica.org)

33.8.8.1 A Letter of Intent to apply for approval as a Championship Breed, signed by at least ten TICA members in good standing;

33.8.8.2 A proposed breed standard; (See 33.8.8) Include as a separate document in the application packet.

33.8.8.3 A proposed breeding program;

33.8.8.4 A processing fee of \$50. Include copy of DAR or other proof of payment (i.e. PayPal receipt, credit card receipt) in application packet.

33.8.9 A Notice of Intent to Apply for Advancement to Championship Status must be published in the TICA TREND at least 120 days prior to the meeting at which the application for advancement will be heard, and which invites comments about the breed to be forwarded to the Executive Office. Submitted for February/March 2016 issue

At the meeting of the Board where application is made: **TICA Annual Meeting August 31-September 2, 2016**

33.8.10 Make a formal presentation at the meeting of the Board of Directors, including photographs, illustrations, statistics, health and breeding reports, examples of the breed and any other relevant material.

FOR INFORMATION ONLY:

33.8.12 No breed may recognize for championship cats which are phenotypically indistinguishable from an already established breed; that is, each breed recognized for championship must be unique. However, this restriction does not apply to registration. Such cats are acceptable for registration and breeding purposes.

33.8.13 If the breed is approved for Championship, a Breed Committee shall be elected in the next regular election.

33.8.14 Meeting the requirements set forth in these rules does not guarantee advancement. The Board of Directors shall judge each request for advancement on a case by case basis.

33.8.15 Every NEW breed must meet the following requirements in each of the next three show years following acceptance in order to retain championship status:

33.8.15.1 Register a minimum of 25 additional cats of the breed.

33.8.15.2 Exhibit a minimum of 10 individual cats of the breed in at least 15 rings in at least 3 regions.

33.8.15.3 Have at least 5 TICA members in a minimum of 3 regions who are actively breeding the breed.

33.8.16 It is the responsibility of the Breed Committee to document that all requirements have been met by providing a report to the Genetics Committee, the Rules Committee and the Executive Office. Failure to meet the requirements of 33.8.15 will result in the breed being returned to Advanced New Breed status.
